U.S. Senator's Report

Washington, DC

Dear Friends,

I've often thought that Maine is just one big small town connected by long roads. Well, in the past year or two, those roads have gotten steeper and bumpier as we dealt with an unprecedented pandemic and the resulting economic troubles.

As we faced the historic challenges, something impressive happened. We came together and lent a hand to our neighbors wherever we could to keep things running and spirits high.

Down in Washington, Congress tried to help Maine communities get through this struggle, so that our state would come out stronger. To do that, we put in the work and set some things into motion that are already helping Maine people. That's why you hired us, after all.

The pandemic made something we'd known for a while clear: those roads and networks that connect our big town needed repair, improvements, and expansion – from bridges to broadband. So, while Maine was uniting towards a common purpose, Congress came together to pass the *Bipartisan Infrastructure Law* – legislation that makes generational investments in physical infrastructure, broadband connections, harbors, and the energy grid. These efforts will lay the foundation for Maine's 21st century economy and make sure even the most rural areas aren't left behind.

Over the last two years, as we drove up and down our state, you couldn't help but see storefronts in trouble and prices rising as the economy struggled through a global recession. And again, while you focused your efforts on getting through the difficult times, Congress took meaningful action. We passed the *American Rescue Plan* in 2021, which enabled Governor Mills and the state of Maine to better meet the health and economic difficulties of the pandemic. At a critical moment it expanded healthcare efforts to confront COVID and invested in the state to keep the economy in far better shape than most others nationwide.

Congress didn't stop there. This year, we took even more concrete steps to cut costs, create jobs, and provide more affordable, cleaner energy. The bipartisan *CHIPS Act* will bring home the manufacturing of the technical components known as "chips" that are used in everything these days – from smartphones to microwaves to cars – and in doing so reduce prices and

create good American jobs. We also passed the *Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)* to lower healthcare costs, allow Medicare to negotiate drug prices, and cut energy bills with new rebates for things like heat pumps and solar panels.

Beyond these major investments, we also passed vital legislation to improve the day-to-day lives of Maine people and Americans nationwide. On a bipartisan basis, we expanded health care for veterans exposed to toxins, strengthened protections for marriage equality, supported Ukraine as it fought off a bloody Russian invasion, secured our elections and the peaceful transfer of power, and delivered millions in federal investments to projects up and down our state.

So, as Maine worked to get through hard times, Congress took steps to support our state – and we’re already starting to see brighter days ahead. I’m proud to have played a small part down here; it’s a true privilege to listen to you, work with you, and build a brighter future for all the incredible people up and down the roads that connect our big small town. Mary and I wish you a happy, and safe 2023.

U.S. Senator's Report

Washington, DC

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the U.S. Senate. I am grateful for the trust that Mainers have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to share some key accomplishments for our state.

Last year, I secured more than \$500 million for 285 projects from Aroostook County to York County that will promote job creation, workforce training, and economic development; expand access to health care; improve public safety, infrastructure, and community resources; and protect our environment. To address the crisis of soaring inflation and high energy prices, I led efforts to provide \$2 billion in supplemental funds to the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program. In the new Congress that begins in 2023, I expect to be the Vice Chairman of the Appropriations Committee and will continue to champion investments to support Maine's communities and families.

Strengthening our economy and supporting good jobs remain a top priority. Along with the Governor and the rest of the Maine Delegation and the associations representing the lobster industry, I worked to protect our hardworking lobstermen and women by pausing for six years the onerous federal regulations that jeopardize our lobster fishery's very existence. Another ongoing threat to Maine's small businesses is the shortage of workers. That's why I led an effort to push the Administration to nearly double the number of H-2B visas that are critical to our hospitality industry. Additionally, when the Administration proposed to cut the construction of a destroyer to be built by Bath Iron Works, I restored this funding to protect Maine jobs and our national security.

When Maine Veterans' Homes announced last year that it planned to close its facilities in Caribou and Machias, I opposed that decision which would have had such a devastating effect on rural veterans and their families. I am glad that the decision was reversed, and I have secured \$3 million to help with upgrades to these facilities. My *AUTO for Vets Act* also became law, which will help disabled veterans maintain their independence by supporting the purchase of a new adaptive vehicle once a decade.

This past year, Congress demonstrated how effective it can be on behalf of the American people when both parties work together. A few of the bipartisan achievements that I was involved in include the *Respect for Marriage Act*, which will provide certainty to millions of loving couples in same-sex marriages while protecting religious liberties, and the *Electoral Count Reform Act*, which establishes clear guidelines for our system of certifying and counting electoral votes for President and Vice President.

No one works harder than the people of Maine, and I have honored that work ethic by showing up for every vote. During my Senate service, I have cast more than 8,500 consecutive votes, never having missed one.

I remain committed to doing all that I can to address your community's concerns in 2023. If I may be of assistance to you in any way, I encourage you to contact one of my six state offices.

U.S. Congress

Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you well. It is my honor and privilege to serve the people of Maine's First District in Washington, DC, and I appreciate the opportunity to share this annual update with you.

This past year, our state faced unprecedented challenges, mirroring the difficulties experienced by communities across the nation. High inflation rates, a rapidly changing climate, aging infrastructure, and increasing energy costs were among the top concerns I heard while home in the district. Keeping these in mind, I was proud to work with my colleagues in the Maine Delegation to pass historic legislation to bring federal dollars back to our communities.

One of the ways we delivered for Mainers was through the passage of the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) in August. This law provides much-needed assistance to struggling families. With the help of the IRA, Americans will save an average of \$800 per year on health insurance and Medicare beneficiaries will have increased access to medication.

Additionally, the IRA offers billions of dollars to expand rebate programs for Americans who wish to make their homes more energy efficient. Homeowners can now receive up to a 30 percent tax incentive for the cost of home solar installations and a 30 percent incentive when investing in a heat pump. Over the next decade, these rebates will offer Mainers thousands of dollars in savings while decreasing fuel costs for winters to come.

In 2022, Congress also passed meaningful legislation to help create skilled jobs in the construction, manufacturing, and engineering sectors. The Creating Helpful Incentives to Produce Semiconductors (CHIPS) Act will allow the U.S. to advance its leadership in the development of semiconductors used in the manufacturing of computers, cell phones, cars, and numerous other technologies we rely on. By developing this industry at home, we can bolster our national security and lessen our reliance on foreign technology.

As I look toward this Congress, I am excited to work with my colleagues on both sides of the aisle to improve the lives of Maine people. It is critically important that we continue to take action to increase job growth, decrease inflation, take measures to promote our national security and invest in our health care and education systems.

Each year my office receives over 40,000 calls, letters, and emails from Mainers. I recognize the tremendous trust you place in having me represent you in Washington and by sharing your stories, thoughts, and concerns. Please rest assured, I will continue to fight for the interests of Mainers in Congress, and my staff and I will do everything we can to ensure your needs are met.

Planning Board

The all volunteer Planning Board had a very busy 2022. The Board's work was divided between ordinance administration and building permits within the Shoreland Zone.

Regarding ordinances, the Medical Marijuana Ordinance was written and subsequently approved by town voters at the annual town meeting in March. The Building Ordinance and Shoreland Zoning Ordinance were revised primarily to conform to changes in State regulations. These two ordinances were approved by town voters at the special town meeting in November.

The Planning Board requests that before submitting a Shoreland Zoning building application, applicants thoroughly review the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance and do the homework necessary in order to speed up the process.

In the next year, the Board anticipates 1) changes to the Building Ordinance due to the new state law (Public Law 672), regarding affordable housing, 2) writing a new ordinance to address solar farms and 3) continual review of Shoreland Zoning building permits.

The Board thanked Walter Bull for his service and welcomed Bill Farren as the new Chairperson.

The Planning Board meets the first Tuesday of the month at 6:00 PM in the Town Hall meeting room.

Jefferson Public Library

This year the Public Library was able to be open all the regular hours, with no closures due to the pandemic. On October 27th we held our first public program since the beginning of the pandemic. Four local authors, Kay Hardy Campbell, Kay Liss, Deborah Walder and Kryill Schabert, read from their books to the gathered attendees. Afterward, there was time for questions and answers, sales of books and lovely refreshments.

We had 833 patrons this year and circulated 666 books. We gained 16 more patrons. We provided applications for the Maine State Library so local folks could set up accounts and order and receive books from that library. We continued to use the McNaughton book rental service and ordered 83 new books, getting books from the New York Times Best Seller List as well as authors requested by our patrons.

Our summer reading program was run as usual, with 15 participants reading 129 books. We had the weekly \$5.00 Jefferson Scoop gift card drawing and the end of the summer Grand Prize of \$25.00 to Sherman's Maine Coast Bookshop in Damariscotta. Our Science Cupboard remains available for exploring the natural world around us.

Our Library Board meets the second Tuesday of every month at 5pm and the meetings are always open to the public. The board members are Ann Liburt, Catherine Moore and Phillipa Beal.

Your friends and neighbors who are the volunteer firefighters and EMTs of Jefferson Fire and Rescue responded to 327 incidents in 2022. Training and Membership

Firefighter training drills continue to be held on the first and fourth Thursday of each month. Jefferson volunteer firefighters dedicated more than 2,000 hours of their time attending numerous training classes and drills throughout 2022. The Emergency Medical Technicians continue to attend training sessions on the second Thursday of each month and attend various classes (totaling more than 250 hours) to acquire the CEH (continuing education hour) credits required to maintain their certifications. Our business meetings are held on the third Thursday of each month.

Jefferson Fire & Rescue currently has 26 members consisting of 25 firefighters, 2 EMTs and 2 Junior Firefighters. We remain the only truly volunteer fire department in Lincoln County. Our firefighters and EMTs do not receive any salary, stipend or other remuneration for responding to alarms. Many other departments pay their members on an hourly basis or provide an annual stipend significantly increasing their annual budget. We welcome anyone interested in volunteering as a firefighter, emergency medical technician, or both to please contact one of the Officers for information and application or leave a message at 549-5394.

Fire Apparatus & Equipment

Our volunteers donate many hours of their time to service and maintain the apparatus and equipment. As the high cost of diesel fuel and other items continue to impact our budget, we continue to look for ways to minimize the burden on taxpayers. An award of \$85,761.90 from the Federal Fire Act Grant Program allowed us to upgrade our communications equipment with the purchase of new mobile radios, portable radios and pagers.

Emergency Medical Service

Jefferson Fire & Rescue continues to provide First Responder service for medical emergencies in our community. Our Emergency Medical Technicians are skilled professionals who respond to victims of illness or injury. Jefferson Fire & Rescue is not a licensed transporting service and therefore a transporting ambulance is dispatched at the same time the call is received.

Waldoboro EMS continues to provide transport ambulance service to the northern half of Jefferson. Central Lincoln County Ambulance will continue to serve the southern sections of Jefferson.

Fire Safety in Your Home

Please remember to check the batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms on a regular basis. The early warning provided by smoke and CO detectors can mean the difference between life and death. Proper maintenance of your heating equipment, especially regular cleaning of chimneys to remove creosote build-up is also important. In the event of a fire, remember that every second counts, so you and your family must always be prepared. Prepare and practice your fire escape plan twice a year. If you have any questions regarding any fire safety concerns, please call us at 549-5394.

Lincoln County Sheriff's Office

In November of 2022, the citizens of Lincoln County elected me to my sixth term as your County Sheriff. The support that the Sheriff's Office in Lincoln County receives from the citizens that elect me each term is truly humbling. It is because of this support that I am constantly trying to find ways to improve the service we provide at a cost we all can afford while providing the transparency that you all deserve.

I am pleased to announce that in 2022 a citizen's advisory committee that has been a goal of mine was finally put in place and has begun its work of providing the Sheriff's Office a wide range of perspectives and opinions on the work we do. This diverse group of citizens from all over Lincoln County are currently assisting me with policy review and our ongoing process of accreditation thru the Maine Law Enforcement Accreditation Program sponsored by the Maine Chiefs of Police Association. If you are interested in serving on this committee or learning more about just what they are doing please reach out to me at any time.

In 2022, we began to formally track the number of mental health related calls for service. The Sheriff's Office works closely with the National Alliance on Mental Illness and we strive to enhance relationships with other community mental health providers to find ways to relieve some of the reliance on law enforcement responding to those having a mental health crisis.

In 2022, this data revealed 177 calls for service that averaged 43 minutes each time. 48 percent of the time, Deputies were able to stabilize the situation based on their own training or with the assistance of community based crisis services. Over 70 percent of these calls were investigated by Deputies with specialized crisis intervention training. Less than 3 percent of these calls resulted in injury to either the Deputy or the person in crisis. The ability to deescalate situations and reduce the risk of injury to all involved is why I am committed to having all my staff trained in Crisis Intervention.

This data did show that almost 55 percent of these calls involved individuals who had previously been involved with a mental health call. Surprisingly, over 10 percent of the time these calls involved individuals that we had responded to assist 10 or more times.

Because of this data, I am committed in 2023 to finding more opportunities to “co-respond” with community mental health providers in hopes of putting in place services to reduce the amount of mental health calls involving the same individual.

Jefferson Scholarship Committee

Jefferson Scholarship Endowment Fund

The Jefferson Scholarship Endowment Fund was established June 1981 at a special town meeting through the efforts of the first committee, Calvin Clark, Melvin Geisler and Andrew Williamson.

At the same time, the Jefferson Woman's Club declared this to be their current Community Improvement Project and the fund began to grow thanks to contributions from local organizations and individuals. As a result, in 1987 the first two awards of \$100 each were presented to deserving high school graduates from the Town of Jefferson.

At the March 1989 Town Meeting, the voters approved the expenditure of \$1,000 every year to the Jefferson Scholarship Endowment Fund.

Ada Packard and Joan Levesque Merit Achievement Awards

The Jefferson Woman's Club was very active in the community for 50 years. Every year the Club awarded two \$100 Merit Achievement awards to graduating seniors from Jefferson. Two Jefferson residents and members of the Woman's Club were honored by naming the awards after them.

When the Woman's Club disbanded, they presented the town with their existing funds to be used for these awards.

Ada Packard was a teacher in the Jefferson Village school and in retirement, volunteered in the classroom several days a week for many years.

Joan Levesque was an active community leader, and served on the School Board and many other committees of the Town.

For both these ladies, education was the key to success and they worked hard and long to provide the best education possible for Jefferson residents.

At present, the interest on the principal is low, so the amount available to award from both these funds in 2022 was \$1,000. However, in 2020 the town approved the expenditure of \$3,000 annually for scholarships, to be awarded in its entirety, not just from the interest earned, so the committee was able to give more money to students.

In 2022, the recipients were Mallory Audette and Allison Bennett. The Committee wishes them and all graduating seniors success in their endeavors.

Jefferson Village School

The Central Lincoln County School System (CLCSS), operating as an Alternative Organizational Structure (AOS 93) serves seven towns: Bremen, Bristol, Damariscotta, Jefferson, Newcastle, Nobleboro, and South Bristol. AOS 93 brings together five elementary schools: Bristol Consolidated, Jefferson Village, Nobleboro Central, South Bristol and Great Salt Bay. Approximately 1,040 students attend PreK to eighth grade in their communities own school district within AOS 93.

AOS 93 is guided by a mission statement with the common purpose of providing high quality learning for all CLCSS students. This system creates a network to implement common curriculum, assessment and instruction aligned with important learning standards that supports all students achieving to high levels.

Alignment with our *Vision*

AOS 93 elementary schools work diligently to provide an innovative learning environment that prepares all of our students for challenges beyond grade eight. AOS 93 does not operate a high school; each AOS 93 town pays the approved state tuition rate to a local public or private high school. The majority of our students attend school locally and a small percentage attend schools with boarding options. In order to receive these public funds, schools must meet criterias for instruction and complete an approval process with the State of Maine. During the 2022-2023 school year there were approximately 540 students attending area public high schools, private academies or equivalency programs.

We strive to teach our students to be good people and do what's right for their neighbors, near and far. Building social and emotional skills has become a priority in our schools as we see increased behavioral needs from our students after a lack of social interaction during the pandemic. Each AOS 93 school has adopted initiatives to support social and emotional growth for students. Teachers support student learning by offering a positive environment for all grade levels. Every staff member contributes to the learning of the students and all staff members are responsible for all students. Staff are diligent in addressing problem student behavior and, as often as possible, acknowledging and commending desired student behavior. Time and effort to train our staff in multiple methods for responses to behaviors continues to be a priority.

Our interest in promoting health and resiliency for our staff and students has extended beyond the pandemic. We continue to follow healthy practices to prevent and mitigate the spread of viruses in our schools. AOS 93 follows the communicable disease protocols as part of normal operations. We continue to maintain cleaning protocols and air filtration protocols to keep our schools safe. Water testing for lead and PFAS has been completed in each of our schools this year and results have been followed up with needed corrections to ensure the safety of the drinking water in each school building.

A continuous safe and supportive learning environment is nurtured for our staff and students. We have implemented updated emergency response protocols and considered upgrades to facilities and staffing to promote school safety in each of our schools this year. Our collaborative efforts with local safety agencies proved effective when tested this year. Every year schools have mandatory training for all staff on the topic of safety. We are grateful for the support of the Damariscotta Police Department and the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department who provided training for staff this fall to reinforce our preventative strategies and build our capacity to respond to safety incidents.

Meeting Emerging Needs

AOS 93 schools have been diligently recruiting and retaining staff in regular and special education. Our dedicated building administrators worked through the summer to hire many new staff for different roles in our elementary schools. Recruited staff were then supported at our New Teacher Academy event, at which staff were presented with a variety of activities and presentations to welcome and support them.

During the summer, intervention efforts for our students who have lost learning during the pandemic continue with a full-day summer school program. Each school partners with CLC YMCA to provide students with targeted academics as well as outdoor, experiential learning opportunities.

Planning Forward

Each school has a Comprehensive Needs Assessment Planning Team working in collaboration with the principal to complete the annual needs assessment, analyzing data to identify emerging academic and behavioral needs. The findings of these teams will be presented to the individual Boards and shared with the staff. The intent is to use collected data to identify goals and more purposefully leverage local, state, and federal funding to target those areas.

A Curriculum Planning Team with teacher members representing each school was recruited to focus on what works and what support is needed. Professional development in all aspects of writing instruction is being planned for this spring. A Math Review is planned to take a close look at both of our math programs to consider how current instruction aligns with best practices, to revisit research-based reviews, and to analyze the math data we have gathered. The results of our review will shape our math curriculum plans moving forward.

Jefferson Village School has worked diligently to create a Multiple Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) to help educators provide academic and behavioral strategies for students. MTSS is a comprehensive framework to meet each student's needs in the most inclusive and equitable learning environment possible. JVS has created a MTSS Guide to leverage resources within the school and have adopted a common form to make the referral process between MTSS and Special Education more efficient in the AOS. With the goal of meeting the needs of all students, JVS teams of educators work together to meet emerging student needs by creating targeted plans for intervention.

We have made it a priority to learn from the shifts during the last couple of years. The technology tools used for distance learning options continue to be used strategically to engage students, their families, and the community. Although it is the preference of many to meet in person, by continuing the asynchronous YouTube viewing option at our monthly Board meetings, we are able to broaden community access and engage more of the community in the business of our schools.

The vibrancy of our local communities and their support for our AOS 93 schools is essential for the attainment of student aspirations. Our common mission of providing high quality learning for all AOS 93 students continues. Together we make a positive difference in the lives of our students, local families, and the communities in which we live and work. We are increasingly coming together to create a network to implement common curriculum, assessment and instruction aligned with important learning standards that supports all students achieving to high levels.

Lincoln Academy

To the Residents of Jefferson,

Thank you for your continuing support of Lincoln Academy, an independent school serving students from midcoast towns since our founding in 1801. The school is thriving thanks to our supportive community, vibrant and diverse student body, and hardworking faculty and staff. After more than two years of pandemic adjustments, we are back to a full schedule of academics and extracurricular programming in the 2022-23 school year.

Here is a quick “by the numbers” look at Lincoln Academy in the 2022-23 academic year:

Current Enrollment: 582 Students from 20 Towns and 15 Countries

- 35% of LA students qualified for free & reduced lunch
- 21% of current juniors and seniors attend vocational programming at BRCTC
- 20% of LA students take one or more AP classes during their years at LA
- 33% of LA students play at least one sport
- 23% participate in band, choir, and/or theater programs

Enrollment: 2022-23 school year enrollment has been strong thanks to large ninth and tenth grade classes. Next year’s incoming class so far looks smaller than the graduating class, but we anticipate total enrollment to remain consistent. The residential program continues to grow, and we expect to have over 50 international and domestic students in the dorm next year.

Academics: Lincoln Academy offers 135 classes, including 42 STEM classes, 30 Performing and Visual Arts classes, 30 Advanced Placement (AP) and honors classes, and 11 vocational certificate programs through the Bath Regional Career and Technical Center (BRCTC).

Athletics: In 2022 LA sports teams found significant success: The girls tennis team won their third State title in four seasons. The boys soccer team and both boys and girls cross country teams won KVAC championships, the girls cross country for the second year in a row. Many individual athletes also won accolades and broke school records in wrestling (one new state champion!), swim, golf, and track and field.

Performing Arts: While performing arts programs were particularly hard-hit by pandemic restrictions, LA's award winning programs have bounced back this year. The theater program staged seven sold-out performances of *Les Miserables* in the fall, and 14 musicians (including band, choir, jazz, and orchestra) qualified for All-State music festivals and 29 qualified for District Honors music festivals.

Of the 125 graduates in the class of 2022:

- 62 enrolled in 4-year colleges
- 21 enrolled in 2-year colleges
- 37 entered the workforce
- 5 entered the military

Two members of the class were National Merit Semifinalists and 17 were AP Scholars. Graduates were awarded over \$350,000 in scholarships through Lincoln Academy, local, statewide, and national foundations.

Faculty Credentials

- 57% of Lincoln Academy faculty have their Master's or other advanced degree
- 5 faculty members have gone beyond their state certification to become National Teacher Certified Teachers

Career Preparation

- The First Annual Peter J. Benner Job Fair in spring 2022 hosted 19 local businesses with immediate openings for employment. Some students were hired on the spot! The second annual Job Fair is planned for April 5, 2023.
- A new weekly Career Exploration Series is currently underway, bringing professionals to campus to meet with students and discuss a wide variety of career paths.
- The online Jobs Board connected dozens of students and recent graduates with summer and year-round jobs at local businesses and organizations.

Erskine Academy

Dear Residents of Jefferson,

Erskine Academy hoped for a safer, healthier, and brighter 2022; we were not disappointed. This school year feels more hopeful and normal than the previous two, with the day-to-day challenges of mitigating the effects of the COVID pandemic receding. With this appreciated respite, Erskine Academy has focused on student safety, achievement, and socioemotional development. Key to these efforts has been building and leveraging relationships with students, families, and our communities - our most promising antidote for trauma and crisis and our best prognosis for recovery, renewal, and revitalization.

In the unprecedented past year, the EA community balanced significant challenges with our commitment to our mission, values, and each others' well-being. This report reflects our unstoppable dedication to teaching, learning, and school life. Our response to the pandemic and the lessons learned have strengthened our resolve to emerge a stronger and better Erskine Academy.

Despite recent challenges, an education fit for the times but steeped in traditional values can always be had here at Erskine Academy. Our current enrollment, approximating 63% of the secondary students from our collective eight sending towns, and a 150-member class of 2026, our largest class in recent history, indicate that our program is broadly desired and consumed by our constituents. Accordingly, we pledge our resources - town-paid tuition, private tuition, and gifts from our alumni and friends - to provide the conditions and educational experiences to inspire our students to their highest potential in school, at work, and within their communities.

Having no enrollment contracts with any community for the whole or a portion of its high schoolers, all students attend here on a voluntary, school-choice basis. This structure enables us to be nimble in our operation and business dealings and expedites problem-solving and decision-making. As we focus on essential teaching and learning processes, we are directly accountable to our students and families, who can leave us for any public high school in the area that may better meet their needs. There is no better system of accountability than the market-style kind that comes from giving parents the freedom to choose schools.

In Erskine Academy's 140th year, we continue to be a high school of choice that combines an independent education with the democratic ideal of a quality education for all. Our core values - *Scholarship, Leadership, Stewardship, and Relationships* - are at work to produce results and deliver the highest educational experience possible. A few facts about Erskine Academy today attest to its vitality and value:

- With 573 students in grades nine through twelve, we are the largest town academy in Maine to serve a nearly 100% local student body on a 100% school choice basis
- A 13:1 professional student-to-teacher ratio
- A 100% graduation rate; a 98% four-year graduation rate for 2022
- A dropout rate of less than one percent
- Of 108 graduates in 2022, 70% were accepted to higher or continuing education, many to highly selective colleges and universities

Although independent, we commit to our publicly funded students by admitting all students from our eight sending towns who have completed the eighth grade and can benefit from our existing programs. Regardless of differences in residence, prior learning, interests, abilities, or personal circumstances and backgrounds, all of our students matter and belong. All who attend here experience a school program that blends traditional values with contemporary programs and best practices to become the most academically and personally prepared young people in our region.

Last year, 152 students enrolled in one or more of nine **Advanced Placement** courses available on an open-enrollment basis; 251 enrolled across our twelve **Dual Enrollment** courses with nearby colleges and universities, taught here by our teachers. Participants in these programs are more likely to enroll in college directly after high school; earn better grades once there; have academic momentum to stay in college and finish; and save dollars spent on college credits. For their efforts in these early college experiences, nearly one-half of our graduates annually earn college credits while in high school; many enter college as second-semester freshman. From 2018 to the present, Erskine Academy students received college credit for 1,281 courses and realized substantial savings in college tuition.

Industry certificates, two-year degrees, apprenticeships, and military service are considered higher education and, as such, viable pursuits. Therefore, we have created and sustained a comprehensive academic program to reflect and facilitate access to these experiences, as well as four-year degree programs. We are one of few high schools in the state to continue to offer shop technology, family and consumer economics, culinary arts, and business courses for exposure and entry-level work. With 66 students

pursuing a certificate in a craft or trade at the **Capital Area Technical Center** in Augusta, Erskine's robust enrollment at CATC is consistently second only to its host, Cony High School.

Staffed by three teachers and two educational technicians, Erskine's **Special Education** program educates and provides specialized support to students eligible for such services through an Individual Education Plan (IEP). Valuing all students and believing they deserve a welcoming school and professional teachers who will build on their strengths, 35% of our students receive specialized **Academic Assistance** or special education services to support their learning.

Now in its eleventh year, our **Jobs for Maine Graduates (JMG)** program has increased student exposure to various forms of higher education and vocational trades programs and has taught essential work-seeking, training, and employment retention skills to those who experience barriers to their learning that are outside of their responsibility.

Having completed an eight-year round as a **MELMAC Education Foundation** school in 2020, we were recently selected for a second round. As a MELMAC school, we increased students' preparedness and aspirations for continuing their education beyond high school, reduced barriers to accessing their higher education, and significantly reduced their need to take remedial courses once in college. In this second iteration with MELMAC, we will implement programming to boost students' readiness for college learning and careers.

In 2022, we became a New York Life's "**Grief-Sensitive School**" to receive staff training to increase and enhance our ability to care for grieving students.

In response to national mass shootings and with school safety our top priority, we recently conducted a third round of schoolwide training in **ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate)**, an enhanced safety program of age and ability-appropriate options-based strategies to use in the event of a violent intrusion on the school. Staff and student training included eLearning, and advisory sessions, physical exercises, and the conducting of active-shooter drills facilitated by administrators and officers from the Maine State Police and the Kennebec County Sheriffs Department. Students report feeling more confident and better equipped to respond to a significant violent assault on themselves or their school due to this training.

With 27% of our students receiving free or reduced breakfast and lunch, our student body is socioeconomically diverse. We are fortunate this year and last to be included in the Maine Department of Education's **Universal Meals Program**, providing all publicly supported students with tray breakfasts and

lunches daily and at no cost to them. However, because our most vulnerable students live and learn in poverty, we continue to operate a school-based clothing and supplies closet and the **Eagles Nest**, an in-school, open-access food pantry and backpack program from which students can obtain food for after school and on weekends.

Erskine Academy students continue to benefit from the best traditions of small-town schools: individualized attention, respect for diversity, a strong cooperative spirit, and numerous opportunities for leadership and service. The wide range of activities pursued by our students and staff is testimony to the vibrancy of the school community.

With COVID occupying less bandwidth in our program, we produced our most favored traditions and activities, such as **Homecoming**, **Winter Carnival**, and an in-person **Senior Week** of activities (including Baccalaureate, Class Night, and graduation).

Even in a prolonged pandemic, our students have done a great deal of good, contributing thousands of hours of community service and raising similar in funds to aid those in need nearby and as far as Central America. Beneficiaries of our school community's goodwill include causes and programs like the Home for Little Wanderers, the United Way's Day of Caring, and local families with significant medical needs. A 13th Annual Cancer Walk, with nearly 100% of our students participating, culminated in raising an aggregated donation exceeding \$50,000 for the Alford Center for Cancer Care. And in the spring of 2023, after a three-year hiatus, some students will travel abroad to Germany, while others will journey to Costa Rica on a humanitarian trip (our eleventh) to build homes in an impoverished village. By embracing volunteerism and stewardship, we engage meaningfully with our communities and experience giving back with appreciation and humility.

Since our founding in 1883, Erskine Academy has remained true to its mission while evolving to meet new demands, challenges, and uncertainties. Because there is no limit to what we can do, pursuing excellence and implementing our mission are continuous and unyielding works in progress. Our school accrediting agency, **The New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc. (NEASC)**, affirmed this in its response to our most recent Five-Year Interim Report: "...the Commission wishes to note the level of attention which the school gives its students. You have developed a truly extensive and effective program - one that is singularly focused on students maximizing their experience and on the post-secondary experiences available to them."

We have heartfelt gratitude for our alumni and friends who believe strongly enough in our values and results that they give their time, talents, and financial donations. Their investment enables us to provide programs and enhancements that state-set tuition alone cannot support and raises our expectations for ourselves.

We are grateful to our students, families, and sending communities for their confidence in and support for Erskine Academy. Together, we create a school and legacy that adheres to what we know is right and good for our young people and aids them in constructing a strong start for adulthood.

Thank you, Jefferson residents, for sustaining high school choice for your young people and families, a provision that is envied by many and available to only about 3% of Maine students. Those families who have chosen Erskine Academy - entrusting us with their children's intellectual, social, and personal development - inspire, honor, and motivate us to make an excellent school even better. In partnership and engagement with you, we look forward to new opportunities and accomplishments in the year ahead.

We have much to celebrate about our past, be proud of at present, and look forward to in the future. In a post-pandemic world such as this, you are succeeding if you are moving onward.

Central Lincoln County (AOS 93) Adult & Community Education

Although this past year saw us able to impact more lives than the previous one, it was nonetheless a challenge to remain vigilant in regard to COVID-19 protocols and guidance. Each time we thought we were finally out of the woods in regard to this pandemic, we would find ourselves back in the forest and looking for the way out. Yet despite all of the challenges, we managed to graduate six students between the ages of 17-28 who are now on a much brighter path to their futures. Our graduation was held on June 7th at the Lincoln Theater and was a truly inspiring event. One of our graduates from last year, Honora Boothby, made the moment especially touching with her hauntingly beautiful rendition of “Meadow Lark” from the musical *The Baker’s Wife*. From the processional to the flipping of the tassels once diplomas were in hand, it was a moving and magical night!

Since 2018 your local adult education program has served 65 students from our seven AOS 93 communities in our high school equivalency program and successfully graduated 36 of them! Additionally, 89 people accessed our College Transitions program for support in finding the right post-secondary school, in getting into the trades, in accessing workforce training, in completing financial forms, or simply figuring out what career might be best given one’s interests and strengths. And finally, this past year we graduated another 17 students in our CNA partnership program with LincolnHealth!

Since 2018, we have registered 1,070 residents of our AOS 93 towns for one or more of our in-person or on-line enrichment classes! From learning sign language to making cheese to getting into the right Medicare program, we here at Central Lincoln County Adult & Community Education have your back! We partner with all of the adult education programs from Topsham to Belfast as well as LincolnHealth, the YMCA, the National Digital Equity Center, the Maine Tasting Center, Central Maine Community College, the Academy of Medical Professions, and the Learning Resources network to provide you with a wide range of learning options - both career-wise and just-for-fun wise. We may be a very small program but through these partnerships we are able to offer a host of new opportunities for both our educational and enrichment clients. Many of these new offerings are able to be accessed remotely which is especially beneficial during these still uncertain times.

Finally, for the first time in many years, your local adult and community education program is seeking an increase in financial support from each of our AOS 93 communities. Both of our federal grants are ending this year and, as you know, the price of almost everything has increased significantly over the past few years. In order for us to continue helping people reach their educational and workforce goals, we need to increase our towns' contributions to something closer to what other adult education programs receive from their local communities. Out of the ten adult education programs in our regional HUB (HUB #7), the local contributions range from 60.56% (Camden/Rockport) to 78.69% (Boothbay Harbor). Our Central Lincoln County program receives only 33.60% in local contributions from our AOS 93 towns. Clearly, we lag behind our adult education counterparts by a significant amount when it comes to local funding. Thankfully, donations from the Burns Family Foundation have enabled us to keep our doors open throughout this pandemic. However, we need to have a more stable and predictable source of income moving forward. I sincerely hope you will vote to support us when it is time to cast your ballot/raise your hand at the annual Town Meeting.

We are beyond grateful to our AOS 93 communities for all of the support we have received over the years and hope it will continue. We are your Learning for Work & Life team and we are here to help make dreams come true!

The mission of Midcoast Conservancy is to protect and restore vital lands and waters on a scale that matters, in partnership with the communities we serve, throughout the Midcoast Maine region through conservation, restoration, outdoor recreation and learning. Our service area comprises 24 towns, three watersheds and over 14,000 acres of conserved land which include 55 preserves and over 95 miles of trails.

In 2022, we completed a scientific analysis to prioritize efforts for our 30x30 Land and Water Conservation Initiative to conserve 30,000 acres of the midcoast area by 2030. Doubling our current conservation efforts will contribute significantly to protecting and restoring the vital lands and waters of the midcoast, act to mitigate the impacts of climate change, and ensure the quality of life our residents and communities deserve.

In Jefferson this year, Midcoast Conservancy worked to do the following:

- Constructed and opened the Roland S. Barth Welcome Center at Hidden Valley Nature Center, allowing us to expand educational and recreational programming there.
- Continued water quality monitoring on Damariscotta Lake and addressed community concerns about cyanobacteria outbreaks there.
- Hosted the first State of the Lake event at Wavus camp in July, which was attended by over 150 community members.
- Completed five Youth Conservation Corps erosion-prevention projects around Damariscotta Lake.

If you were fortunate enough to ride the trails in Jefferson this year, you may have encountered some trails that were not groomed, overgrown, or blocked by downed trees. Since we only have a handful of active members, maintaining the full 45 miles of trail is virtually impossible. If you find any trails that are not groomed, please reach out to us and let us know! Or better yet, please join the club and lend a helping hand to keep our trails signed, groomed, and open for all to enjoy.

The club is funded through snowmobile registration rebates earmarked by the state for trail maintenance, trail maintenance grants, membership dues, various fundraising efforts, and the generous support of area businesses.

The Transfer Station, operated by Nobleboro and Jefferson, and under contract with Bremen, Damariscotta, and Newcastle, provides for the disposal of most types of solid waste generated in the five towns. In 2022 our household waste, construction, demolition, and bulky waste all went to Waste Management in Norridgewock, ME. We use the services of Lincoln County Recycling to recycle cardboard, newspaper, plastic and many other products. We also recycle our universal hazard waste (televisions, computer, fluorescent light bulbs, mercury switches and rechargeable batteries)

2022 saw a lot of changes in our staff. Brandon Achorn and Glenn Daiute left us in the fall. Thank you both for all your service. We hired John Arsenault as our new manager of the facility. We then hired Howard Griffin and Shawn Wilkie as full-time attendants. Along with Kevin Nunes they work hard to keep things running smoothly. With all the changes we were able to keep things running without problems. We hope your trip to the Transfer Station continues to be a positive experience.

I would like to thank everyone who takes the time to recycle. This effort really helps us save money in the long run. We do have programs for recycling paint, food waste, metals, electronics, paper, and cardboard. In 2022, we had a hazardous waste day for people to get rid of there hazardous chemical and other hazardous materials. We hope to do the same again this year. We will be advertising for this so be watching for it.

The outlook for 2023 is that we hope to continue our efforts to recycle whenever we can. The attendants are more than willing to help you recycle. Everything you recycle helps reduce the amount it costs to put items in the mainstream trash.

We are looking to keep things the same in 2023. We try to be efficient as possible to save taxpayers money. Thank you for you cooperation with the staff. They enjoy working with you.

Explanation: This will allow the Select Board to continue road repair and maintenance during the winter when there has been an extreme number of storms as well as allowing the Select Board to continue issuing General Assistance to qualifying people in the event that there is a spike in applications. In both cases it will avoid the necessity of calling a special town meeting in order to plow the roads or to give assistance to a qualifying resident if appropriated funds run out.

Art. 11. Shall the Town of Jefferson authorize the Select Board, on behalf of the Town, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon such terms as they deem advisable and to execute quit claim deeds for same? The Select Board is required to advertise the sale of such property for “sealed” competitive bid in the Kennebec Journal, Lincoln County News, and Portland Press Herald at least two weeks prior to such action and to sell such property to the highest bidder or sell it back to the previous owner. The Select Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids. In the event that no bids are acceptable the Select Board may at their discretion choose another means available to sell the property, including listing with a real estate agent. Except that the Municipal Officers shall use the special sale process required by 36 M.R.S. § 943-C for qualifying homestead property if they choose to sell it to anyone other than the former owner(s).

Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to accept prepayments of taxes not yet committed and to pay interest rate of 0% (zero) as a courtesy to taxpayers who wish to prepay some or all of their uncommitted taxes.

Art. 13. Shall an ordinance entitled “Town of Jefferson Moratorium Ordinance Regarding Commercial or Community Solar Energy Facilities” be enacted?
