U.S. Senator's Report

Washington, DC

Dear Friends,

Thank you for allowing me to add my congratulations and gratitude for the positive differences each town and city in Maine makes for its people and ultimately for Maine as a whole. When I travel around the state and visit the various regions in Maine, I see firsthand the differences you all make, the focus you put on excellence, and the helping hands you extend to neighbors. I have learned valuable lessons watching your collaborations with each other. They got the State motto right - *Dirigo* - because you all certainly do lead the way and exemplify the best of Maine.

First, it was a true honor to be appointed to the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee this year to help address the challenges facing Maine veterans. We owe our way of life to these brave men and women and share a collective responsibility as a grateful nation to give back to our veterans. That means delivering veterans the benefits they have earned, addressing the veterans' suicide crisis, improving transition-to-civilian-status programs, and ensuring every veteran can access essential services, like affordable housing and behavioral healthcare.

Supported through funding in the bipartisan infrastructure bill, we are now within striking distance of broadband service even in our most rural communities. Serious steps are being taken to address the toll from substance abuse and to provide our older neighbors with resources to help them continue to stand strong throughout their golden years. It is my goal here to make sure everyone has access to stable employment opportunities and quality healthcare which is of critical importance to keep our families healthy and happy.

I am thankful for each town in Maine for their commitment to their communities, to their citizens, and to this country. I will do my part to listen to your concerns and work to find useful solutions to the issues you face.

My offices throughout Maine remain available to you if you face hurdles with the federal government, whether it be veteran issues, social security problems, student loans, immigration, tax assistance and more. I hope you will reach out of my offices in Presque Isle, Bangor, Augusta, Portland, or Biddeford and allow me the chance to be part of your solutions. Together, I know we can continue to build a stronger, brighter future for our great state.

Maine is known for our grit and resiliency and we are making great strides - something others across the country have noticed. U.S. Senator's Report

Washington, DC

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to serve the people of Maine in the U.S. Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share an update on issues important to Maine and America.

One of my priorities for 2023 has been to improve the appropriations process in Congress - the way it decides how to spend taxpayer money. I took over as the Vice Chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee last year. Along with Chair Patty Murray, we decided the best change we could make was not to do something new. Instead, it was to do something old - that is, go back to the regular and transparent committee process that we used to have.

Part of restoring this process included holding 50 public Committee hearings, which allowed for input from senators on both sides of the aisle. As a result, for the first time in five years, the Senate Appropriations Committee passed all twelve of its funding bills on time. This was done with strong bipartisan support. In fact, seven of them passed unanimously.

Now, we need to work with the House of Representatives to pass these twelve bills and turn them into laws.

These bills contain funding for a wide range of Maine priorities, including support for the workforce at Bath Iron Works and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, our lobster industry, infrastructure improvements, affordable housing, biomedical research, veterans, and heating assistance programs like LIHEAP. These bills also contain nearly \$590 million in Congressionally Directed Spending for 231 projects throughout the State of Maine. These projects would help promote job creation, expand access to health care, and improve public safety, infrastructure, and important resources in communities across all 16 counties of our state. I will continue to work to get these bills signed into law in the new year.

On October 25, the horrific mass shooting in Lewiston claimed the lives of 18 Mainers and injured 13 others. In response, I led Maine's Congressional Delegation in requesting an independent investigation by the U.S. Army Inspector General into the events leading up to the shooting.

On December 15, the Under Secretary of the Army wrote to inform me that such an investigation will take place, and the Army Inspector General has instructed her team to immediately begin preparing to conduct this investigation. While nothing can undo the events of October 25, I will continue to work to understand what happened and what could have been done differently, and to find answers for the victims, survivors, and their families.

No one works harder than the people of Maine, and this year I honored that work ethic when I cast my 8,855th consecutive roll call vote.

As we look ahead to 2024, I remain committed to addressing the concerns of Maine families and communities. If you need assistance or wish to share your thoughts, please do not hesitate to reach out to one of my six state offices.

Each year, Congress enacts appropriations bills that provide the federal government with the funding it needs to operate. CPFs are a critical tool to directly support local governments and nonprofit organizations through federal appropriations. If you know of a project that might be a good fit, I encourage you to keep in touch as more details about the Fiscal Year 2025 funding process become available, as eligibility requirements and limitations can differ from year to year.

It is always a privilege to hear from you, so don't hesitate to reach out to my office any time that I can be helpful. Please rest assured that I do not take the responsibility of representing you lightly, and as we move into this new year, I will continue fighting for Mainers on the issues that impact us most. State Representative's Report

I must once again thank the residents of Jefferson for giving me the opportunity to serve as your State Representative and participate in what I believe is an incredible adventure. Serving as a Freshman Representative in the 131st Legislature has proven to be an intense learning experience. The 131st Legislature has completed its first regular session and first special session. Between these two sessions the legislature processed 2,019 bills.

The majority of my effort was spent on the Joint Standing Committee for Education and Cultural Affairs. This committee held public hearings and work sessions on 213 bills. I attempted to approach each bill with an open mind and listen attentively to each person testifying. The question I ask is: How does this bill affect you, the constituents in my district? I'm there to represent all of you.

With significant increases in tax revenues the Legislature chose to grow state government rather than reform the income tax structure and help us all with the challenges we face due to inflation. The Legislature repealed the *Property Tax Stabilization Act* rather than adopt revisions that would benefit our seniors, especially those with a fixed income. High energy costs continue to plague us and continue to deter industry from coming to Maine. The proposed statutory changes were not adopted by the Legislature. Reducing those costs will not only have a positive effect on our cost of living, but will also make our state more attractive to those high energy consuming industries.

The second session is scheduled to convene on January 3, 2024. I encourage you to participate in your state government, local government and school board. Phone calls and letters are always welcome; and thanks to the wider use of technology, meetings and hearings are even more accessible. Using the homepage of the Maine Legislature: Legislature.Maine.Gov, you will find access to committee hearings via Zoom, where you can observe or testify *for or against* a bill from the comfort of your home. I will be sending a weekly email newsletter with current state news. Again, thank you for giving me the honor of serving you at the State House and may you all have a safe and healthy 2024.

Planning Board

The all-volunteer Planning Board focuses on reviewing building permits within the Shoreland Zone and maintaining town ordinances on behalf of the Select Board. The Planning Board's notable actions for 2023 are summarized below.

Regarding permits, the Planning Board approved 22 new/amended building permits. Two building permits were denied approval.

Regarding ordinances, the Board wrote a Solar Farm Moratorium Ordinance that the town then approved at the April 2023 annual town meeting. This moratorium was extended in September to allow the Board sufficient time to write a full Solar Farm Ordinance that will be voted on at the April 2024 annual town meeting. At the request of the Select Board, the Medical Cannabis Ordinance is being revised to clarify differences between a new application and a renewal application.

An application for a new cannabis caregiver retail store was approved for operation on Rockland Road.

In the next year, the Board anticipates 1) a town vote on the Solar Farm Ordinance, 2) continuing review of Shoreland Zone building permits, 3) amending the Building Ordinance due to the new state law (Public Law 672), regarding affordable housing and 3) amending the Shoreland Ordinance for clarification.

The Planning Board requests that before submitting a Shoreland Zone building application, applicants thoroughly review the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance and do the necessary homework in order to avoid delays in the approval process.

The Board sadly accepted Linda Pierpont's resignation as the Board's secretary and profoundly thanks her for her many years of public service to the town of Jefferson.

The Planning Board meets the first Tuesday of the month at 6:00 PM in the Town Hall meeting room.

Jefferson Public Library

The Library was able to be open most of this year, excepting when we had to close while repairs were being done to the school sprinkler system. The Girl Scouts used the library for meetings until September when they moved to a space that was better for their craft programs.

During 2023, we served 605 patrons and circulated 568 books. Happily, we had 9 new patrons this year. Using the McNaughton Book Rental Service, we brought into the Library 91 new books. Many choices from the New York Times best seller list and other favorite authors of our patrons, which include Maine Authors like Paul Doiron, Tess Gerritsen, and Stephen King! Nonfiction is always ordered as well as various genres of fiction in both regular print and large print.

We had two public events, the first was author Bill Anthony reading from his book “Farnsey,” and the other was “Q&A with the EMA,” with Maury Prentiss, Director; Emily Huber, Deputy Director; and Brandon Look, Training and Operations Specialist; discussing Code Red and Project Lifesaver.

Our summer Children’s Reading Program had 9 children participating by reading 89 books. Each week one reader’s name was drawn and they received a \$5.00 Gift Certificate for delectable ice cream from the Jefferson Scoop. At the end of the summer one child’s name was drawn for the Grand Prize of \$25.00 to the Sherman’s Midcoast Book Shop.

There is no cost to become a patron at the Jefferson Public Library. I would like to thank all who use the library and donate time and resources to us. Many thanks to the Library Board of Trustees, Ann Liburt, Catherine Moore, and Phillipa Beal. The Library Board meets on the second Tuesday of the month at 5pm and the public is more than welcome to join us.

We are located in the Jefferson Village School library and our hours are Tuesday and Thursday from 4pm to 7pm. In the summer we’re open Wednesdays during the same hours. During the school year, we close when the school closes for bad weather and the closings are carried on Channel 8. If possible, closings are also posted on the Jefferson Public Board and Jefferson Community Board pages on Facebook.

“Professionally Served by Volunteers since 1941”

Your friends and neighbors who are the volunteer firefighters and EMTs of Jefferson Fire and Rescue responded to 323 incidents in 2023. There were 3 structure fires, 26 motor vehicle accidents, 6 woods fires, 1 vehicle fire and 184 medical calls. We also responded to provide mutual aid to neighboring communities 22 times.

Training and Membership

Firefighter training drills continue to be held on the first and fourth Thursday of each month. Jefferson volunteer firefighters dedicated more than 2,000 hours of their time attending numerous training classes and drills throughout 2023. The Emergency Medical Technicians continue to attend training sessions on the second Thursday of each month and attend various classes (totaling more than 250 hours) to acquire the CEH (continuing education hour) credits required to maintain their certifications. Our business meetings are held on the third Thursday of each month.

Jefferson Fire & Rescue currently has 26 members consisting of 23 firefighters, 2 EMTs and 1 Junior Firefighter. We remain the only truly volunteer fire department in Lincoln County. Our firefighters and EMTs do not receive any salary, stipend or other remuneration for responding to alarms. Many other departments pay their members on an hourly basis or provide an annual stipend significantly increasing their annual budget. We welcome anyone interested in volunteering as a firefighter, emergency medical technician, or both to please contact one of the Officers for information and application or leave a message at 549-5394.

Fire Apparatus & Equipment

In June, we welcomed our new Engine 1 to Jefferson. Engine 1 is a 2023 Rescue Pumper that can pump 1,500 gallons of water per minute and carries 1,000 gallons of water. The new fire truck was manufactured by Sutphen Corporation, a family-owned fire apparatus manufacturer in business since 1890. A major factor in the decision to purchase the new apparatus from Sutphen is based on the fact that a 1987 Sutphen fire truck we purchased used from the Monsey, NY Fire Department in 2010 has served us well since we purchased it. The 1987 pumper, formerly designated Engine 1, will remain in service as Engine 5. The new Engine 1 is designed to serve as a fully functioning pumper but also carries a full complement of rescue and EMS equipment including our “Jaws of Life” hydraulic extrication tools. The new Engine 1 replaces our 1989 Ford/Emergency-One Pumper that was removed from service due to significant corrosion of the frame, and a 1993 American LaFrance Pumper for which repair parts are no longer available, since American LaFrance is no longer in business.

Emergency Medical Service

Jefferson Fire & Rescue continues to provide First Responder service for medical emergencies in our community. Our Emergency Medical Technicians are skilled professionals who respond to victims of illness or injury. Jefferson Fire & Rescue is not a licensed transporting service and therefore a transporting ambulance is dispatched at the same time the call is received.

Waldoboro EMS continues to provide transport ambulance service to the northern half of Jefferson. Central Lincoln County Ambulance will continue to serve the southern sections of Jefferson.

Fire Safety in Your Home

Please remember to check the batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms on a regular basis. The early warning provided by smoke and CO detectors can mean the difference between life and death. Proper maintenance of your heating equipment, especially regular cleaning of chimneys to remove creosote build-up, is also important. In the event of a fire, remember that every second counts, so you and your family must always be prepared. Prepare and practice your fire escape plan twice a year. If you have any questions regarding any fire safety concerns, please call us at 549-5394.

Help Us Help You!

Many of you live in homes that are located on private roads or long driveways. The use of large reflective address signs can help us quickly locate your home. Jefferson Fire & Rescue can provide these signs for you at a nominal fee. Additional information on these signs and order forms are available at the Town Office. If your home or camp is located on a private road or a long driveway please remember that ambulances and fire trucks are larger than cars. It is important to properly maintain your driveway or private road. Keep them clear of overgrown bushes, low hanging tree branches, snow & ice and other obstacles that may delay our response to your emergency.

Thank You

It is a privilege to serve our town as fire chief. And I owe a profound gratitude to those who have served before me.

- Walter Morris joined the department in 2006, when he relocated to Maine from New York. He served as chief for 12 years, from 2010 until 2022. He was fortunate to join a fire department that was built on a solid foundation, thanks to Chief Robert (Bob) Walker, our current chief's father. Chief Morris's primary goal was to continue Bob's legacy. During his tenure, the department received about \$500,000.00 in grants and donations (including the donation of a firetruck) that allowed us to purchase new equipment. We were also able to improve our Insurance Service Office (ISO) rating to lower fire insurance premium costs for our businesses and residents.

- Alan Johnston's service to Jefferson Fire & Rescue spans decades. He not only intimately knows the roads of Jefferson, he has helped build a number of them! His knowledge of the town, and of its residents, continues to prove invaluable as assistant chief, after he stepped down from his one-year term as chief last year.

In closing, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the residents of Jefferson for another year of continued generous support. Your donations and attendance at our annual Chicken Barbeque, Harvest Supper, and other fundraising activities are greatly appreciated.

It is a privilege to serve as fire chief. The members of Jefferson Fire & Rescue are extremely dedicated, hard-working men and women. Lincoln County Sheriff's Office

As I begin my twenty-second year I want to once again thank you for the opportunity to serve as the Lincoln County Sheriff. During my time in office I have been privileged to find myself surrounded by men and women working hard every day to provide the best possible public safety services for each of you.

During the past several years some of my toughest challenges have been staffing during a period when greater accountability and transparency have been expected, while the interest in those seeking a career in public safety seems to have diminished.

Despite these challenges, I have worked hard with our County Commissioners to develop policies and practices to attract and retain employees to Lincoln County. I did this while being the first Sheriff in Maine to begin a Citizens Advisory Board with a goal of improving our transparency and providing valuable insight and opinions as we work to improve policy during a law enforcement accreditation process.

I am happy to report that I expect that in early 2024 the staffing level at the Sheriff's Office will have reached a point that will allow us to be more proactive with the public safety we provide without adding any additional positions to the budget.

Planning has begun to put in place a Deputy to provide dedicated traffic enforcement in areas of high crash and complaints. Traffic complaints are one of the most common concerns I hear in the community. I hope by assigning a Deputy to this position we can improve traffic safety and better respond to the concerns I have been hearing for many years.

Additionally, I hope to assign another Deputy to a position of Community Resource Deputy. This Deputy's primary focus will be building relationships with those vulnerable populations in Lincoln County that are at high risk or often subject to crime. I anticipate that by building relationships with these vulnerable populations (elderly, children, mentally ill, substance use disorder, domestic violence etc.) the Deputy can begin working on strategies to reduce crime and make our County a safer place to live.

I look forward to serving you again in 2024 and once again want to thank you for the opportunity to serve as your Sheriff.

Jefferson Scholarship Committee

Jefferson Scholarship Endowment Fund

The Jefferson Scholarship Endowment Fund was established June 1981 at a special town meeting through the efforts of the first committee, Calvin Clark, Melvin Geisler and Andrew Williamson.

At the same time, the Jefferson Woman's Club declared this to be their current Community Improvement Project and the fund began to grow thanks to contributions from local organizations and individuals. As a result, in 1987 the first two awards of \$100 each were presented to deserving high school graduates from the Town of Jefferson.

At the March 1989 Town Meeting, the voters approved the expenditure of \$1,000 every year to the Jefferson Scholarship Endowment Fund.

Ada Packard and Joan Levesque Merit Achievement Awards

The Jefferson Woman's Club was very active in the community for 50 years. Every year the Club awarded two \$100 Merit Achievement awards to graduating seniors from Jefferson. Two Jefferson residents and members of the Woman's Club were honored by naming the awards after them.

When the Woman's Club disbanded, they presented the town with their existing funds to be used for these awards.

Ada Packard was a teacher in the Jefferson Village school and in retirement, volunteered in the classroom several days a week for many years.

Joan Levesque was an active community leader, and served on the School Board and many other committees of the Town.

For both these ladies, education was the key to success and they worked hard and long to provide the best education possible for Jefferson residents.

At present, the interest on the principal is low, so the amount available to award from both these funds doesn't go very far. However, in 2020 the town approved the expenditure of \$3,000 annually for scholarships, to be awarded in its entirety, not just from the interest earned, so the committee was able to give more money to students.

In 2023, the recipients were Aowyn Burbank, Cadence Rau, Abigail Reed, and Abigail St. Cyr. The Committee wishes them and all graduating seniors success in their endeavors.

Jefferson Village School

The Central Lincoln County School System (CLCSS), operating as an Alternative Organizational Structure (AOS 93) serves seven towns: Bremen, Bristol, Damariscotta, Jefferson, Newcastle, Nobleboro, and South Bristol. AOS 93 brings together eight smaller school districts under the umbrella of AOS #93, which provides Central Office services. We encompass five elementary schools: Bristol Consolidated, Jefferson Village, Nobleboro Central, South Bristol and Great Salt Bay, and are responsible for all secondary students as well. Approximately 1,020 students attend PreK to eighth grade in their town's own school district within AOS 93. AOS 93 does not operate a high school; each AOS 93 town pays the approved state tuition rate to a local public or private high school. Through their high school, students have the opportunity to attend vocational programming, mainly at Bath Area Tech Center, Capital Area Tech Center, or Midcoast Tech Center. The majority of our students attend school locally and a small percentage attend schools with boarding options. In order to receive these public funds, schools must meet criterias for instruction and complete an approval process with the State of Maine. During the 2023-2024 school year there were approximately 540 students attending area public high schools, private academies or equivalency programs.

AOS 93 is guided by a mission statement with the common purpose of providing high quality learning for all CLCSS students. This system creates a network to implement a common curriculum, assessment and instruction aligned with important learning standards that supports all students achieving a high level during the school years. During the summer, intervention efforts for our students who have lost learning during the pandemic continue with a full-day summer school program. Each school partners with CLC YMCA and Coastal Rivers Conservation Trust to provide students with targeted academics as well as outdoor, experiential learning opportunities.

The vibrancy of our local communities and their support for our AOS 93 schools is essential for the attainment of student aspirations. Our common mission of providing high quality learning for all AOS 93 students continues. Together we make a positive difference in the lives of our students, local families, and the communities in which we live and work.

Jefferson Village School enrollment remains steady with approximately 234 students. These numbers are consistent with the school year '21-'22 and we predict these numbers to increase slightly for school year '24 - '25. Jefferson Village School has hired several new staff to fill positions to accommodate the needs of our students in grades K-8. The following teachers have been added to the JVS staff to fill our open positions: Shania Beverage (1st Grade), Kaitlynn Morrissey (4th Grade), Emily Hall (Grades 5-8 Science), Lacey Ryder (Speech and Language Clinician), Rebecca Shafer, (Special Education Teacher), Mary Biscoff (Virtual Case Manager), Kolleen O'Donnell (School Counselor funded in full by EASE Maine Grant), Chase Macioch (Technology Integrator), Karen Anderson (Kitchen Manager), and Wendy Crawford (Administrative Assistant). JVS also hired Janet Delmar to serve as building principal. Mrs. Delmar officially began duties on August 21, 2023. We continue to advertise and look to fill remaining vacancies within the school building.

JVS continues to provide a number of enrichment activities for our students, in conjunction with their academic instruction and learning. Andy Bartlett led our 8th grade students as they participated in a service project for Veterans' Day that included raking leaves at the Maine Veterans Cemetery in Augusta. With the support from art teacher Rachael Richmond and music teacher Molly Kaye, the entire student body helped produce a video thanking our veterans for their service. This video was distributed to veterans in our Maine Veterans homes. Our Kindergarten students sang Christmas Carols to residents of the Lincoln Home and JVS students collected and donated nonperishable items to the Jefferson Food Pantry to help our families in need. The JVS Library also held its annual Holiday Fundraiser. Thank you to all the teachers and staff at JVS for continuing with these important enrichment activities for our students.

Lincoln Academy

To the Residents of Jefferson,

Thank you for your continuing support of Lincoln Academy, an independent school serving students from midcoast towns since our founding in 1801. The school is thriving thanks to our supportive community, vibrant and diverse student body, and hardworking faculty and staff.

Lincoln Academy “By the numbers”

- 25% of LA students qualified for free & reduced lunch (underreported since lunch is free for everyone)
- 20% of juniors and seniors attend vocational programming at BRCTC
- 18% of LA students take one or more AP classes during their years at LA
- 54% of LA students play at least one sport
- 23% participate in band, choir, and/or theater programs

2023-24 Facilities Upgrades:

LA’s historic bell tower is scheduled for structural repairs. The bell itself is currently being refurbished by Elderhorst Bell Company in Pennsylvania. The belfry and tower will be shored up, starting with the foundation, before we return the bell to its traditional perch.

In the summer of 2024 we will replace the light poles on the William Clark field. The new lights will be more energy efficient and throw off less light pollution during night games, and a new sound system will be integrated into the new poles.

Enrollment: 564 Students from 21 Towns and 13 Countries:

Enrollment numbers have been positive, with our current ninth grade class size exceeding last year’s predictions. Next year’s incoming class (the class of 2028) is expected to be very close in number to the graduating Class of 2024, and we anticipate total day student enrollment to remain consistent next year. The residential program continues to grow, and we expect to have over 40 international and domestic students in the dorm next year.

Academics: Lincoln Academy offers 135 classes, including over 40 STEM classes, more than 30 Performing and Visual Arts classes, 33 Advanced Placement (AP) and honors classes, and 11 vocational certificate programs through the Bath Regional Career and Technical Center (BRCTC).

Athletics: In 2023 LA sports teams won conference championships in both boys and girls tennis, girls track, boys soccer, and both boys and girls cross country. We had seven Kvac Coach of the year awards, three Good Sportsmanship awards, and school records broken in track and field. Individual athletes won Kvac championships in wrestling, swimming, track and field, and cross country. Roan Donaghy '25 of Damariscotta won the Class B State Championship in Racewalk, and Kellen Adickes '25 of Bristol won the New England Golf Championship.

Performing Arts: The theater program staged seven sold-out performances of The Crucible in the fall of 2023. 13 musicians (including band, choir, jazz, and orchestra) qualified for All-State music festivals, while 45 qualified for District III Honors music festival.

Of the 149 graduates in the class of 2023:

- 74 enrolled in 4-year colleges
- 39 enrolled in 2-year colleges
- 34 entered the workforce
- 2 entered the military

One member of the class was a National Merit Semifinalist and 44 were AP Scholars. Graduates were awarded over \$350,000 in scholarships through Lincoln Academy, local, statewide, and national foundations.

Faculty Credentials

- 57% of Lincoln Academy faculty have their Master's or other advanced degree
- 4 faculty members have gone beyond state certification to become Nationally Teacher Certified Teachers

Career Preparation

- The Second Annual Peter J. Benner Job Fair hosted 30 local businesses with immediate openings for employment. Some students were hired on the spot! The third annual Job Fair is planned for April 3, 2024.
- A weekly Career Exploration Series is currently underway, bringing professionals to campus to meet with students and discuss a wide variety of career paths.
- The online Jobs Board connected dozens of students and recent graduates with summer and year-round jobs at local businesses and organizations.

- Erskine Academy offered **85 total courses** in the 2022-2023 academic year.
- Erskine Academy offered **9 Advanced Placement (AP)** courses that enrolled 124 students.
- Erskine Academy offered **12 Dual-Enrollment** college courses that enrolled 281 students.
- **662 free college courses** were successfully completed at Erskine Academy by students still in high school from 2020-2022, representing roughly **\$794,500** saved by local students and families.
- **68 students (29%)** attended the **Capital Area Technical Center (CATC)**, gaining knowledge in the skilled trades and earning certificates toward competency.

- Erskine Academy has a plethora of student activities and clubs. With 32 athletic teams over three seasons and **23 clubs and activities** available, **ALL** students find themselves involved and part of Erskine Academy's vibrant student life.

I offer my sincerest gratitude to the residents of Jefferson for upholding the valuable opportunity of high school choice for your youth and families - a privilege coveted by many and accessible to only approximately 3% of Maine students. Central Lincoln County (AOS 93) Adult & Community Education

Central Lincoln County Adult & Community Education is thankful for the support shown by its communities over the past four decades. There have been many changes to the charge of adult education since the 2014 passing of the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), the greatest of these being a focus on preparing adults for the workforce. While high school completion (formerly the GED program, now HiSET) continues to be a main focus, the state and federal governments as well as local demand have created the need to go beyond a focus on high school to post-secondary certifications, workforce preparation, and college and career advising. We assist students well beyond their high school graduation and have adults continue to return as their lives and goals change. In addition, we create opportunities for community members to engage in the school community through life-enriching activities. We hope you will continue to support and join us on our journey.

money from the state (State Subsidy), local taxes (the Local Contribution), and our primary grants AEFLA (the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act federal grant) and MCCA (the Maine College and Career Access state grant).

Adult and Community Education Local Enrollment

In terms of students served, CLCAE has a wonderful reputation throughout the midcoast for helping students succeed where they have yet to be successful in their local high school due to a variety of reasons. We continue to see a need for increased services. The COVID-19 pandemic may be over, but the effects on teenage students are now being felt. 2023 represented the first year of completing high school students who did not have a single year of 'normal' school attendance.

For FY23, there were 10 student enrollments in academic programs from Jefferson. This represents 14.5% of the enrollments within the AOS. There were an additional 40 enrollments in enrichment classes, representing 10.5%.

We see student enrollments increasing in college and career advising, with many working with us to help determine the best pathways based on career values and interests and the availability of funding in support of further education. Traditional CNA classes have become “hybrid” with part of the class taught live via Zoom and clinicals on-site at hospitals throughout the entire midcoast region. Meetings with career navigators happen both virtually and onsite at our office. Nearly all students spend a portion of their classes accessing materials through online learning management systems. Technology use has increased significantly, and all of the adults in our communities have FREE access to learning about Microsoft products, computer basics, and online security. We will continue to adapt as needed to enable the adults in our communities to succeed and improve opportunities for their families.

The Jefferson SnoPackers Snowmobile Club, through the cooperation of area landowners, constructs and maintains a 45-mile trail system in Jefferson for use by the general public. Landowners graciously support the club's efforts in permitting winter sports of snowmobiling, cross-country skiing, and snowshoeing or hiking, to take place on a groomed trail system. Club volunteers clear and maintain the trail system and groom the trails when snow conditions permit.

While our active club membership is still small, we did have some new members join us in the 22-23 season. We're aware there are still many sleds registered in Jefferson. Please support your favorite winter sports by joining the club and helping with trail work!

We hold monthly in-person potluck meetings at the Jefferson Fire Station at 6 pm on Tuesdays, starting in October and usually going until April (depending on snow.) A reminder to landowners: as properties are sold, we ask that sellers who have trails crossing their property encourage new buyers to continue to grant permission for existing trails. The new buyers will then be doing their part to ensure that this time-honored recreation continues to be available to all the citizens of Jefferson. If you are a new landowner and our trails cross your property, please contact us at jeffersonsnopackers@gmail.com so that we can update our landowner database.

If you were fortunate enough to ride the trails in Jefferson this year, you may have encountered some trails that were not groomed, overgrown, or blocked by downed trees. Since we only have a handful of active members, maintaining the full 45 miles of trail is virtually impossible. If you find any trails that are not groomed, please reach out to us and let us know! Or better yet, please join the club and lend a helping hand to keep our trails signed, groomed, and open for all to enjoy.

The club is funded through snowmobile registration rebates earmarked by the state for trail maintenance, trail maintenance grants, membership dues, various fundraising efforts, and the generous support of area businesses.

Nobleboro/Jefferson Transfer Facility

The Transfer Station, operated by Nobleboro and Jefferson, and under contract with Bremen, Damariscotta, and Newcastle, provides the disposal of most types of solid waste generated in the five towns. In 2023, our household waste, construction, demolition, and bulky waste all went to Waste Management in Norridgewock. We use the services of Lincoln County Recycling to recycle cardboard, newspaper, plastic, and many other products. We also recycle our universal hazard waste (televisions, computer, fluorescent light bulbs, mercury switches and rechargeable batteries).

2023 did not see a lot of change in our staffing. John Arsenault is still our manager and doing a great job keeping the station running smoothly. We still have Howard Griffin and Kevin Nunes. Glenn Daiute has come back and replaced Shawn Wilkie. They all work hard to make sure your trip to the transfer station is a positive experience.

I would like to thank everyone that takes the time to recycle. This effort really helps us save money in the long run. We do have programs for recycling paint, food waste, metals, electronics, paper, and cardboard. In 2023, we had two hazardous waste days for people to get rid of their hazardous chemical and other hazardous materials. We hope to do the same again this year. We will be advertising this so be watching for it.

The outlook for 2024 is to continue our efforts to recycle whenever we can. The attendants are more than willing to help you recycle. Everything you recycle helps reduce the amount it costs to put items in the mainstream trash.

Also in 2024, we are planning on replacing one of the compactors and buying two new trash containers. This has changed the amount the towns have to raise.

The Transfer Station is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Tuesday through Saturday. The front gate is closed at 3:50 p.m. each night to allow time to close out the computer. We are closed on Sunday and Monday. This allows our staff to have two days off in a row.

We will continue to review our operations in effort to provide good service and the most efficient Transfer Station possible. We are interested in your comments and recommendations and will attempt to incorporate them whenever possible.

Art. 2. To elect by secret ballot the municipal officers for the ensuing year. Namely, one Select Board Member/Assessor/Overseer of the Poor for a three-year term, four members of the Budget Committee for a three-year term, three members of the budget committee for a two-year term, and one member of the School Committee for a three-year term.

Explanation: This will allow the Select Board to continue road repair and maintenance during the winter when there has been an extreme number of storms as well as allowing the Select Board to continue issuing general assistance to qualifying people in the event that there is a spike in applications. In both cases it will avoid the necessity of calling a special town meeting in order to plow the roads or to give assistance to a qualifying resident if appropriated funds run out.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to require the municipal officers to provide the former owner(s) of tax-acquired property, or if deceased his/her/their heirs, personal representative or devisees six months to repurchase the property on terms the Board deems in the best interests of the Town; if the former owner does not repurchase the property the municipal officers may sell the property through the sale process in 36 M.R.S. § 943-C, provided that if the former owner does not timely request that process or the Board is unable to list or sell the property as required by § 943-C(3), the Board may sell the property in any manner it deems in the best interests of the Town. For sales to someone other than the former owner, excess sale proceeds, as defined in 36 M.R.S. § 943-C, shall be returned to the former owner.

This article reflects law changes enacted by the State of Maine and became effective June 30, 2023.
