## U.S. Senator's Report

### Washington, DC

Each year comes with renewed hope — to celebrate each other's successes and care for each other in times of need. I have also worked with my Veterans Affairs and Defense partners in Washington to successfully pass a national defense bill that strengthens our national security, takes care of our service members, and supports Maine businesses from Aroostook to York County.

## U.S. Senator's Report

### Washington, DC

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share several key accomplishments for our state from the previous year.

As Vice Chair of the Appropriations Committee, I have secured nearly \$580 million for 230 projects across all of Maine's 16 counties to promote job creation, workforce training, and economic development; expand access to health care; support law enforcement; improve public education and infrastructure; and protect our environment. As the new Congress begins, I am honored to be taking the helm of the Committee, the first Mainer to do so in nearly a century, and I remain committed to ensuring that federal spending produces real results for our state and nation.

Maine has the oldest average age in the country, which is why I have long prioritized health-focused legislative efforts. There were more than 1,860 health care bills introduced during the 118th Congress. Only 15 health care bills were signed into law, and I was a lead sponsor of five of them. These bills will enhance care for individuals with Alzheimer's, autism, and substance abuse issues through improved research funding, strengthened public health programs, and increased support for rural first responders.

Another important bill that I coauthored was the *Social Security Fairness Act*. Since 2003, when I led the first-ever Senate hearing on the Windfall Elimination Provision and the Government Pension Offset, I have sought to end these provisions of the *Social Security Act* that unfairly reduce the Social Security benefits that public employees or their spouses have earned. I am pleased to say that with the passage of my bill, the *Social Security Fairness Act*, in December, public sector retirees will now receive the full Social Security benefits they have earned.

When the Maine way of life was under threat, I was certain to defend the interests of our state. I worked to protect Maine's potato farmers when the Department of Agriculture tried to reclassify the potato from a vegetable to a grain. I thwarted efforts to consolidate USPS mail operations at the Hampden postal facility, which would have disrupted mail delivery throughout our state. I sounded the alarm with leaders at the FBI and Departments of State and Treasury on the spate of illicit marijuana growing operations that are destroying properties and providing refuge to foreign criminals in our state.

Following damage to our working waterfronts after last winter's storms, I secured \$15 million to help fishing communities recover. I championed funding to support the Maine Air National Guard base, Bath Iron Works, and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard.

As of last December, I have cast more than 9,100 consecutive votes, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997. My ranking as the most bipartisan Senator reflects Maine's tradition of working with a spirit of cooperation and respect.

## U.S. Congress

As we welcome the New Year, I want to extend my sincerest well wishes for 2025: to you, your loved ones, and your community. I'd also like to share an update on what my team and I have been working on - and how we intend to continue serving Maine's First District in the next Congress.

One year ago, our state was reeling from a series of unprecedented winter storms. Thanks to the efforts of local, state, and federal officials, we're starting to rebuild. The Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Small Business Administration approved more than \$10.7 million in federal assistance for Maine households, businesses, and homeowners in the months following the storms. In addition, Maine received a \$69 million grant from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to support the climate-resilience goals outlined in *Maine Won't Wait*. More help is needed, no doubt, and I will continue to advocate for the support our state deserves. In 2024, \$1.7 billion in federal grant funding came to Maine - encompassing everything from conservation efforts and home-heating assistance to resilient infrastructure and affordable housing. My team was able to secure \$1.4 million in refunds for Maine taxpayers, along with \$639,000 in Social Security benefits. We also helped thousands of constituents file for work permits, veterans benefits, and passports, and wrote countless letters of support on behalf of our constituents.

I'm so proud of what we achieved in 2024, and I'm fully committed to building on those accomplishments in the 119th Congress. As ever, my team and I are ready to assist however we can. ## Planning Board

The all-volunteer Planning Board focuses on reviewing building permits within the Shoreland Zone and maintaining town ordinances on behalf of the Select Board. The Planning Board's notable actions for 2024 are summarized below.

Eleven new or amended building permits were approved. One subdivision application division was also approved.

Regarding ordinances, the Planning Board completed a new Solar Farm Ordinance that was approved at the November 5, 2024 general election. An amended Building Ordinance was also approved at that time and implements Public Law 672, allowing for additional and accessory dwelling units.

In the next year, the Board anticipates 1) continual review of Shoreland Zone building permits, 2) amending the Building Ordinance to adopt safety requirements for residential and commercial solar energy systems, 3) amending the Medical Cannabis Ordinance to address changes in the State medical cannabis law and to clarify differences between a new application and a renewal application and 4) amending the Shoreland Ordinance for clarification.

The Planning Board requests that before submitting a Shoreland Zone building application, applicants or their designated representative thoroughly review the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance and do the necessary homework in order to avoid delays in the approval process.

The Planning Board meets the first Tuesday of the month at 6:00 PM in the Town Hall meeting room. Members include Dana Clark, Bill Farren, Joan Jackson, Tom Kirvan and Gary Olsen.

## Jefferson Public Library

The Public Library was able to be open throughout this year, with no unexpected closures. There were School Board meetings held in the space as well as PTA meetings.

During 2024 we served 658 patrons, and circulated 1,074 books. We added 13 new patrons to our lists. Using the McNaughton Book Rental Service, we brought in 69 new books. I used the New York Times bestseller list to guide my choices, as well as favorite authors requested by patrons. We have a nice selection of new non-fiction. We also purchased from the Jefferson Market 26 new books, all of which are Maine writers.

We had two public events, August 11 was the author David Charters reading from his book "Resident Agent". This is a fun read placed in Lincoln County around Damariscotta Lake. The second event was a presentation by Mariaelana Solorzano regarding computer and phone scams perpetrated in Lincoln County. She left us with a list of phone numbers and people to contact if we should happen to be scammed.

Our summer reading program had 6 children participating. We tried a Bingo Card style challenge. One child, each week, who turned in their Bingo Card had their name drawn for a \$5.00 gift certificate to the Jefferson Scoop. At the end of the summer, there was a grand prize of a \$25.00 gift certificate to the Sherman's Maine Coast Book Store.

There is no cost to become a patron of the Jefferson Public Library. Our hours are Tuesday and Thursday, 4 pm to 7 pm. In the summer we are open the same hours, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. During the school year we are closed on school vacations.

I would like to thank the Library Board of Trustees, Ann Libuert, Catherine Moore and Philippa Beal, for their many years of service to the Library.

## Jefferson Fire & Rescue

**“Professionally Served by Volunteers since 1941”**

Your friends and neighbors who are the volunteer firefighters and EMTs of Jefferson Fire and Rescue responded to 353 incidents in 2024. There were 6 structure fires, 31 motor vehicle accidents, 2 woods fires, 1 vehicle fire and 217 medical calls. We also responded to provide mutual aid to neighboring communities 21 times.

### **Training and Membership**

Firefighter training drills continue to be held on the first and fourth Thursday of each month. Jefferson volunteer firefighters dedicated more than 2,000 hours of their time attending numerous training classes and drills throughout 2024. The Emergency Medical Technicians continue to attend training sessions on the second Thursday of each month and attend various classes (totaling more than 250 hours) to acquire the CEH (continuing education hour) credits required to maintain their certifications. Our business meetings are held on the third Thursday of each month.

Jefferson Fire & Rescue currently has 26 members consisting of 23 firefighters and 3 EMTs. During 2024 we had 3 new firefighters complete their Basic Fire School training which allows them to wear self-container breathing apparatus and serve as Interior Firefighters. One of our firefighters completed over 200 hours of training and achieved his National Firefighter I & II Certification. We also had two members obtain their EMT Certification. We remain the only truly volunteer fire department in Lincoln County. Our firefighters and EMTs do not receive any salary, stipend or other remuneration for responding to alarms. Many other departments pay their members on an hourly basis or provide an annual stipend, significantly increasing their annual budget. We welcome anyone interested in volunteering as a firefighter, emergency medical technician, or both to please contact one of the Officers for information and application or leave a message at 549-5394.

### **Fire Apparatus & Equipment**

We continue to operate two pumper trucks, one tanker truck, one forestry truck, one first responder EMS vehicle and a rescue boat. Like you, we face the challenge of maintaining a high level of service while minimizing our expenses and the tax burden on the community. We continue to work hard to find alternative funding methods. In 2024, our members successfully applied for and were awarded three grants:

- Federal Assistance to Firefighter Grant of \$122,076.19 for the purchase of 26 sets of personal protective equipment (coats, pants, boots, helmets, gloves and hoods) for our firefighters
- Maine State Emergency Medical Service Grant of \$29,000.00 to purchase EMS equipment and supplies and provide training for our Emergency Medical Technicians
- Maine Municipal Association Safety Grant of \$3,000.00 to purchase new Traffic Control Equipment (reflective vests, illuminated STOP/SLOW paddles, road cones) used when operating at motor vehicle accidents, tree/wires down, and other roadway incidents

**Emergency Medical Service**

Jefferson Fire & Rescue continues to provide First Responder service for medical emergencies in our community. Our Emergency Medical Technicians are skilled professionals who respond to victims of illness or injury. Jefferson Fire & Rescue is not a licensed transporting service and therefore a transporting ambulance is dispatched at the same time the call is received.

Waldoboro EMS continues to provide transport ambulance service to the northern half of Jefferson. Central Lincoln County Ambulance will continue to serve the southern sections of Jefferson.

**Fire Safety in Your Home**

Please remember to check the batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms on a regular basis. The early warning provided by smoke and CO detectors can mean the difference between life and death. Proper maintenance of your heating equipment, especially regular cleaning of chimneys to remove creosote build-up is also important. In the event of a fire, remember that every second counts, so you and your family must always be prepared. Prepare and practice your fire escape plan twice a year. If you have any questions regarding any fire safety concerns, please call us at 549-5394.

**Help Us Help You!**

Many of you live in homes that are located on private roads or long driveways. The use of large reflective address signs can help us quickly locate your home. Jefferson Fire & Rescue can provide these signs for you at a nominal fee. Additional information on these signs and order forms are available at the Town Office. If your home or camp is located on a private road or a long driveway please remember that ambulances and fire trucks are larger than cars. It is important to properly maintain your driveway or private road. Keep them clear of overgrown bushes, low hanging tree branches, snow & ice and other obstacles that may delay our response to your emergency.

## Lincoln County Sheriff's Office

I am happy to report that in 2024 the staffing level at the Sheriff's Office reached a point that allowed the implementation of a long-budgeted traffic safety position. This position will allow the Sheriff's Office to provide a dedicated traffic law enforcement presence in areas of high crashes and complaints. This work began in 2024, and I am pleased to provide a focused response to a problem I hear from many of you throughout the County.

Additionally, I have assigned a Deputy to the position of Community Resource Deputy. This Deputy's primary focus will be building relationships with those vulnerable populations (elderly, children, mentally ill, substance use disorder, domestic violence etc.) in Lincoln County that are at elevated risk or often subject to crime. I am pleased to report that this work has begun, and it has been met with strong support from those who it is intended to serve. I anticipate that these relationships built will result in a reduction in crime and a County that is safer place for all of us to live.

Both were implemented in 2024 without having to add additional positions.

Also, in 2024 a comprehensive structural assessment of the Sheriff's Office in Wiscasset was conducted. This assessment indicated that our facility that first opened in 1985 would require almost 7.5 million dollars in repairs and renovations to reach current code and building standards. This assessment was the first step by the County Commissioners in determining the viability of maintaining our current facility with repairs and renovations versus constructing a new facility at a different location. You can view this assessment on the County website *lincolncountymaine.me*.

These discussions will continue in 2025 and I hope that they will not only address the conditions and location of our current facility, but also the size of our facility and if it meets our needs in 2025 and into the future.

I look forward to serving you again in 2025 and want to thank you for the opportunity to serve as your Sheriff.

## **Jefferson Scholarship Committee**

### **Jefferson Scholarship Endowment Fund**

The Jefferson Scholarship Endowment Fund was established June 1981 at a special town meeting through the efforts of the first committee, Calvin Clark, Melvin Geisler and Andrew Williamson.

At the same time, the Jefferson Woman's Club declared this to be their current Community Improvement Project and the fund began to grow thanks to contributions from local organizations and individuals. As a result, in 1987 the first two awards of \$100 each were presented to deserving high school graduates from the Town of Jefferson.

At the March 1989 Town Meeting, the voters approved the expenditure of \$1,000 every year to the Jefferson Scholarship Endowment Fund.

### **Ada Packard and Joan Levesque Merit Achievement Awards**

The Jefferson Woman's Club was very active in the community for 50 years. Every year the Club awarded two \$100 Merit Achievement awards to graduating seniors from Jefferson. Two Jefferson residents and members of the Woman's Club were honored by naming the awards after them.

When the Woman's Club disbanded, they presented the town with their existing funds to be used for these awards.

Ada Packard was a teacher in the Jefferson Village school and in retirement, volunteered in the classroom several days a week for many years.

Joan Levesque was an active community leader, and served on the School Board and many other committees of the Town.

For both these ladies, education was the key to success and they worked hard and long to provide the best education possible for Jefferson residents.

At present, the interest on the principal is low, so the amount available to award from both these funds doesn't go very far. However, in 2020 the town approved the expenditure of \$3,000 annually for scholarships, to be awarded in its entirety, not just from the interest earned, so the committee was able to give more money to students.

In 2024, the recipients were Maia Hall and Abigail Kopp. The Committee wishes them and all graduating seniors success in their endeavors.

## **The Central Lincoln County School System (CLCSS) - AOS 93**

CLCSS operates as an Alternative Organizational Structure (AOS 93) and currently serves seven towns: Bremen, Bristol, Damariscotta, Jefferson, Newcastle, Nobleboro, and South Bristol. AOS 93 brings together eight smaller school districts under the umbrella of AOS #93, which provides Central Office services. These services include the Superintendent's Office, Business Office, and Special Services.

In 2024-2025 the AOS is made up of five elementary schools: Bristol Consolidated, Jefferson Village, Nobleboro Central, South Bristol and Great Salt Bay, and are responsible for all secondary students as well. With the start of the 2025-2026 school year the three towns that send students to Great Salt Bay will depart from the AOS and form their own school district. AOS 93 will continue with the towns of Bristol, Jefferson, Nobleboro, and South Bristol.

Over 1,000 students attend PreK to eighth grade in their own communities within AOS 93. AOS 93 does not operate a high school, each AOS 93 town pays the approved state tuition rate to a local public or private high school. Through their high school, students have the opportunity to attend vocational programming, mainly at Bath Area Tech Center, Capital Area Tech Center, or Midcoast Tech Center. The majority of our students attend school locally and a small percentage attend schools with boarding options. In order to receive these public funds schools must meet criteria for instruction and complete an approval process with the State of Maine. Approximately 560 students attend area public high schools, private academies or equivalency programs.

AOS 93 is guided by a mission statement with the common purpose of providing high quality learning for all CLCSS students. This system creates a network to implement a common curriculum, assessment and instruction aligned with important learning standards that supports all students achieving a high level during the school years. We are fortunate to have some very strong administrators, teachers, and support staff working with our students within the district



The different geography and demographics within each of our towns is something that we respect and appreciate. Our common mission of providing high quality learning for all AOS 93 students continues, regardless of the school a student attends. Together we make a positive difference in the lives of our students, local families, and the communities in which we live and work.

The schools that will continue to be AOS 93, as we move into the future, are excited about the possibilities the new configuration will allow. District and building administration are looking forward to the opportunity to collaborate and make AOS 93 the best possible district it can be for our students, stag families, and communities. We will strive to help students develop lofty aspirations and provide the pathways necessary for them to successfully achieve these.

I have truly enjoyed my first year serving the students and families of AOS 93 and look forward to developing greater connections with the communities in an attempt to provide the most efficient and successful educational system possible.

## Jefferson Village School

Jefferson Village School enrollment is down slightly from the past few years. We currently have approximately 210 students attending our K-8 school. JVS has hired several new staff to fill positions to accommodate the needs of our students in grades K-8. The following teachers have been added to the JVS staff to fill our open positions: Thorsten Zimmerman (Grades 6-8 Science), Amber Taylor-Soares (Speech and Language Assistant), Mary Alice McCann (60% Music Teacher), Jennifer Gagne (Special Education Virtual Case Manager), Kara Paul (Special Education Teacher), and Amy Kupstas (Administrative Assistant). We continue to advertise to fill the remaining vacancies within the school building.

JVS students continue to take advantage of a variety of enrichment and co-curricular activities in conjunction with their academic instruction and learning. Our third graders had the opportunity to take tennis lessons this fall and are ice skating this winter. Our fourth graders visit the Hidden Valley Nature Center throughout the school year to participate in a variety of outdoor learning activities and our middle-level students have worked with Coastal Rivers Conservation Trust for educational programs. Many of our middle-level students participate in co-curricular activities such as our co-ed soccer team, girls and boys basketball, softball, baseball, and track. This year assistant principal, Ms. Mewa is working with a group of students to create a new student council organization. Our kindergarten and fourth grade students sang Christmas Carols to residents of the Lincoln Home and JVS students collected and donated non-perishable items to the Jefferson Food Pantry to help our families in need. The JVS Library also held its annual Holiday Fundraiser. Thank you to all the teachers and staff at JVS for continuing with these important enrichment activities for our students.

## Lincoln Academy

To the Residents of Jefferson,

Thank you for your continuing support of Lincoln Academy, an independent school serving students from midcoast towns since our founding in 1801. The school is thriving thanks to our supportive community, vibrant and diverse student body, and hardworking faculty and staff.

### **Lincoln Academy “By the numbers”**

- Total 2025-26 enrollment: 587 students
- 18% of juniors and seniors attend vocational programming at BRCTC
- 22% of students take one or more AP classes
- 25% of students qualify as low socioeconomic status (SES)
- 44% of LA students play at least one sport
- 20% participate in band, choir, and/or theater programs
- 5% of students are in alternative education programs

Enrollment: 587 students from 23 towns and 18 countries are currently enrolled at LA, with our current ninth grade class size exceeding last year’s predictions. The incoming Class of 2029 is expected to be larger than the graduating Class of 2025, so we anticipate total day student enrollment to grow again next year. Our dorm will soon be at full capacity with 50 international and domestic students in residence, contributing income to the overall school budget.

Academics: Lincoln Academy offers 135 classes, including over 40 STEM classes, more than 30 Performing and Visual Arts classes, 33 Advanced Placement (AP) and honors classes, and 11 vocational certificate programs through the Bath Regional Career and Technical Center (BRCTC).

Athletics: In 2024 LA sports teams won conference championships in wrestling and boys tennis. We had four KVAC Coach of the Year awards, two Good Sportsmanship awards, and school records broken in several sports. Individual athletes won KVAC and state championships in wrestling and track and field. The boys basketball team made it to the Class B South Regional Finals for the first time since 1989.

2024-25 Facilities Upgrades: We are thrilled with the bell tower repairs completed by alum Robin O'Brien '93 and his team. The bell was rung at Homecoming in September, 2024 with nearly two hundred alumni in attendance. We replaced three HVAC units in the Ryder Science Wing, upgraded our fire alarm system for the entire campus, overhauled and modernized the electric panels in the original building, and replaced the sound system in the gymnasium. We installed new lights on the turf field and the Boosters donated a new speaker system as well as a refresh and upgrade for the indoor fitness center.

Of the 132 graduates in the class of 2024:

- 81 enrolled in 4-year colleges
- 36 enrolled in 2-year colleges
- 15 entered the workforce

Two members of the class were National Merit Semifinalists and 45 were AP Scholars. Graduates were awarded over \$375,000 in scholarships through school endowments and local, statewide, and national foundations.

Performing Arts: The theater program staged a production of Macbeth in the fall of 2024. 13 musicians (including band, choir, jazz, and orchestra) qualified for All-State music festivals, while 45 qualified for District III Honors music festival.

Faculty Credentials: 57% of Lincoln Academy faculty have their Master's or other advanced degrees

Career Preparation

- The 3rd Annual Peter J. Benner Job Fair was held in April 2024 and included 30 local businesses with immediate openings for employment. We also invited 8th graders from AOS 93 schools as well as seniors from Wiscasset High School to join us for the job fair. The 4th Annual Fair is planned for April 2, 2025.
- Through the Community-Based Learning Experience (CBLE) program, students have the opportunity to learn about a profession and gain valuable work experience, academic credit, and sometimes hours towards a professional certification. In 2024 17 students worked with 13 businesses, and we are planning to increase this number in 2025.
- Lincoln's online Jobs Board connected dozens of students and recent graduates with summer and year-round jobs at local businesses and organizations.

## Erskine Academy

Progressing through our 141st year, Erskine Academy remains humbled by the opportunity to continue serving the students and families of Jefferson. With a current enrollment of 525 students, 31 residing in Jefferson, we remain committed to providing a comprehensive educational experience that prepares all students for success as future workers and citizens.

This past year has marked a period of remarkable advancement, both in educational programming and facility improvements, made possible through the steadfast support of the Jefferson community. The introduction of an enhanced high-tech innovation lab and expanded curriculum offerings in new media has opened new academic pathways for Jefferson students, preparing them more thoroughly for future careers in science and technology. Recent statewide assessment data posted by the Department of Education again show Erskine Academy outperforming the state and regional average scores in reading and mathematics. Additionally, in collaboration with local business leaders and municipal officials, Erskine Academy has developed a “Portrait of a Graduate.” This intentional instructional approach, led by Erskine Academy’s exceptionally competent and dedicated faculty and staff, extends beyond our robust content-focused curriculum to ensure students graduating from Erskine Academy possess the personal traits needed for success as scholars, workers, and citizens. The development of skills and habits such as problem-solving, engagement, civility, integrity, and being a contributing member of a team are now cemented in Erskine Academy’s daily instructional approach. To fortify these work habits, Erskine Academy has developed an Extended Learning Opportunities (ELO) program that facilitates the successful navigation of local internships and apprenticeships for Erskine Academy seniors. ELO, a credit-bearing academic program, provides our local businesses with nearly two dozen workers, each receiving guidance and support from EA.

Alongside these educational developments, substantial facility improvements have enhanced the safety and functionality of Erskine Academy’s historic campus. Critical infrastructure projects included the installation of a new gymnasium roof to address water leakage and prevent potential mold development, as well as the renovation of the front entrance of the main building to remediate structural weakening that had occurred overtime. With the assistance of our local Amish community, students now

benefit from a thoughtfully designed courtyard that serves dual purposes as both a welcoming lunch gathering space and an open outdoor classroom setting. This extensive renovation initiative also encompassed replacing over 100 windows throughout the campus, replacing siding, and implementing advanced security measures, including enhanced exterior lighting and electronic door access systems. These significant improvements have been made possible through our sending towns insured value factor (IVF) obligation and the dedicated contributions of our alumni, whose stewardship to Erskine Academy remains unwavering. It is particularly noteworthy that through constant attention and careful maintenance, our original buildings from the 1930s continue to provide a secure and welcoming educational environment for current and future generations of students.

Erskine Academy is currently engaged in the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) accreditation process, demonstrating our unwavering pledge to educational excellence and continuous improvement. This thorough independent evaluation and educational audit reflects our promise to maintain the highest standards of academic quality, student support, and institutional effectiveness. By voluntarily participating in this rigorous peer-review process, we affirm our responsibility to the families who entrust us with their children's education and to our communities whose resolute support enables EA to fulfill our mission.

A snapshot of Erskine Academy's achievements includes:

- Erskine Academy is approved for state tuition through the Maine Department of Education (MDOE) and accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). The accreditation process occurs every ten years, with Erskine Academy's decennial process currently underway.
- Enrollment of **525 students** in grades nine through twelve.
- **33%** of Erskine Academy students qualify for **reduced or free lunch**, a statistic frequently underreported given the state's pledge to provide free breakfast and lunch to all students.
- A **12:1 student-to-teacher ratio**
- A **99% graduation rate**
- Of 121 prospective graduates, **100% will graduate with a viable and accessible post-secondary plan**. Plans include higher or continuing education in 4 and 2-year programs, many to highly selective colleges and universities, apprenticeships with local companies, and military service.
- Erskine Academy offered **10 Advanced Placement (AP)** courses that enrolled **84 students**.



- Erskine Academy offered **14 Dual-Enrollment** college courses that enrolled **302 students**.
- **337 free college courses** were successfully completed (**87.3% success rate**) at Erskine Academy by students still in high school last year, representing roughly **\$416,532** in tuition costs saved by local students and families.
- **48 students (9.14%)** attended the **Capital Area Technical Center (CATC)**, gaining knowledge in the skilled trades and earning certificates toward competency.
- Erskine Academy has numerous student activities and clubs. With **32 athletic teams** over three seasons and **23 clubs and activities** available, **ALL** students find themselves involved and part of Erskine Academy's vibrant student life.

As I have in the past, I extend our profound appreciation to the Jefferson community for your resolute commitment to high school choice—an exceptional opportunity desired by most families but available to only 3% of Maine's student population. Your continued trust in allowing Erskine Academy to serve as your educational partner is a privilege we consistently strive to honor with respect and dedication.

## By the Numbers

Central Lincoln County Adult & Community Education (CLCAE) is part of the Maine Department of Education’s MidCoast Hub 7 collaborative that includes 9 programs spread across the 4 midcoast counties from Sagadahoc north through Waldo. Each of the nine programs relies on a combination of money from the state (State Subsidy), local taxes (the Local Contribution), and our primary grants AEFLA (the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act federal grant) and MCCA (the Maine College and Career Access state grant).

In terms of students served, CLCAE has a wonderful reputation throughout the midcoast for helping students succeed where they have yet to be successful in their local high school for various reasons.

For FY24, there were 13 student enrollments in academic programs from Jefferson. This represents 12.26% of the enrollments within the AOS. There were an additional 59 enrollments in enrichment classes, representing 13.7%. Jefferson’s share of the local contribution to adult education in 2024 was 22.8%.

We see student enrollments increasing across all areas, with many requesting help to determine the best career pathways based on their values and interests. Traditional CNA classes have become “hybrid” with part of the class taught live via Zoom and clinicals on-site at hospitals throughout the midcoast region. We continue to run CNA classes four times a year in collaboration with MaineHealth. Meetings with career navigators happen both virtually and onsite at our office. We partner with Workforce Solutions to help fund tuition for workforce training. Nearly all students spend part of their classes accessing materials through online learning management systems. Technology use has increased significantly, and all adults in our communities have FREE access to learning about Microsoft products, computer basics, and online security. We will continue to adapt as needed to enable the adults in our communities to succeed and improve opportunities for their families.

## **Nobleboro/Jefferson Transfer Facility**

The Transfer Station, operated by Nobleboro and Jefferson, and under contract with Bremen, Damariscotta, and Newcastle, provides for the disposal of most types of solid waste generated in the five towns. In 2024 our household waste, construction, demolition, and bulky waste all went to Waste Management in Norridgewock, ME. We use the services of Lincoln County Recycling to recycle cardboard, newspaper, plastic, and many other products. We also recycle our universal hazard waste (televisions, computer, fluorescent light bulbs, mercury switches and rechargeable batteries).

2024 did not see a lot of change in our staffing. John Arsenault is still our manager and doing a great job keeping the station running smoothly. We still have Glen Daiute and Kevin Nunes. We have hired Jonathon Corey to replace Howard Griffin. They all work hard to make sure your trip to the transfer station is a positive experience.

I would like to thank everyone who takes the time to recycle. This effort really helps us save money in the long run. We do have programs for recycling paint, food waste, metals, electronics, paper, and cardboard. In 2024 we had two Hazardous Waste Days for people to get rid of their hazardous chemical and other hazardous materials. We hope to do the same again this year. We will be advertising this so be watching for it.

The outlook for 2025 is a hope to continue our efforts to recycle whenever we can. The attendants are more than willing to help you recycle. Everything you recycle helps reduce the amount it costs to put items in the mainstream trash.

The Transfer Station is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Tuesday through Saturday. The front gate is closed at 3:50 p.m. each night to allow time to close out the computer. We are closed on Sunday and Monday. This allows our staff to have two days off in a row.

We will continue to review our operations in effort to provide good service and the most efficient Transfer Station possible. We are interested in your comments and recommendations and will attempt to incorporate them whenever possible.

For sales to someone other than the former owner, excess sale proceeds, as defined in 36 M.R.S. § 943-C, shall be returned to the former owner.
